In a fast paced and multi-tasking medical world, sensory perception sometimes takes a back seat. However your senses--the way you see, hear, touch, smell and even taste--can provide you with crucial information. Heightening your senses can also help you be more in the moment and develop your own creative vision. Join us at the MET for a workshop which will build up your sensory abilities as you focus on a unique multi-sensory exploration of art works. This workshop will be led by Senior ArtMed inSight facilitator Deborah Lutz.

Cost: \$125 for single sessions; \$235 for both workshops; \$85 for medical students (includes the museum entrance fee)

Art experience is welcome but not necessary--Location: The MET Museum in NYC

Deborah Lutz: is Senior Facilitator for ArtMed inSight and a Senior Art Lecturer at the MET Museum. She has taught ArtMed inSight courses for NYU Langone Medical Center and Mount Sinai St Luke's Hospital. At the MET, she has lectured on numerous aspects of the collection including permanent and temporary exhibits such as most recently *Visitors to Versailles*. Deborah is an accomplished visual artist and professor of drawing at Manhattanville College and Westchester Community College. In addition, with a strong interest in multi-sensory explorations, she leads a process-based drawing class *Seeing Through Drawing* for blind and vision-impaired visitors at the MET.

Anna Willieme, MFA, is the founder and director of ArtMed inSight. She is on the seminar faculty of Columbia University Medical Center and NYU Medical School and leads ArtMed inSight programs at leading medical institutions in Boston and New York City. Willieme has also been a lecturer at the Metropolitan Museum of Art for over ten years and is a visual artist with exhibition experience in galleries and public spaces in both the US and Europe.
